## Spring is Here! Green it Up!

Some tips for "greening" up your spring...

**Limit use of chemical fertilizers and pesticides:** natural alternatives (such as greensand and corn gluten meal) are widely available, and are safer for people and wildlife. See www.planetnatural.com or your local garden center.

**Compost:** start a compost pile or buy a compost bin. It's a great way to recycle kitchen scraps and yard waste, and enrich your garden at the same time. See www.compostguide.com or call the Burlington County Office of Solid Waste to order one for \$40 (609-499-1001 x271)

**Plant natives:** plants and trees that are native to this region require minimal watering and feeding, are pest-resistant and contribute to wildlife habitat, and prevent invasive (non-native) species from taking over. See the *Native Plant Society of NJ* website (www.npsnj.org) for tips and a directory of sources for purchasing native plants.

**Create a backyard wildlife habitat:** provide wildlife with the basic elements needed for survival: food, water, cover and places to raise young, along with sustainable gardening practices. Visit the National Wildlife Foundation website to learn more: www.nwf.org/backyardwildlifehabitat/

**Join a CSA Farm:** community-supported agriculture farms offer "subscriptions" to an entire season's worth of locally grown, often organic produce. Honeybrook Organic Farm makes weekly deliveries to Bordentown City. See www.honeybrookorganicfarm.com for details.

#### **Stream Monitoring Project**

The BCEC teamed up with the Watershed Area #20 Ambassador and members of the Bordentown Boy Scout Troop #13 to perform a stream monitoring project in Bordentown City. Visual and chemical assessments were performed on Blacks Creek, Thorntown Creek, and Love Bridge Run. Water was tested for nitrates and phosphates, pH, conductivity, dissolved oxygen, and temperature. Results will be published on the BCEC website later this year.

#### Tree Planting at Gilder Field

The BCEC and the Bordentown Shade Tree Committee (BSTC) joined forces recently to secure \$27,000 worth of free trees and tree removal services from the NJ Department of Transportation. The BCEC approached the DOT Good Neighbor Landscaping program regarding its work along Rt. 206 and Rt. 130 in Bordentown Twp. An agreement was reached to provide additional services, at no cost, to the City. The BSTC then devised a maintenance and planting plan for Gilder Field, which included the removal of several diseased trees and the planting of thirty-six (36) new 3-inch caliper trees, including elms, sycamores, black locusts and red maples. DOT will provide a 1-year maintenance guarantee of their work. This project will dramatically enhance the area around Carslake Community Center, the adjacent playground, and the Gilder Field bleachers and parking lot. Thanks very much to George Caruso at DOT for making this happen. Stop by this spring and see how green it is!

#### **Bicycle & Pedestrian Circulation Plan**

The Bordentown City Bicycle & Pedestrian Circulation Plan was presented to the Planning Board and the public at the Planning Board meeting on March 1. Comments were generally favorable, with several residents praising the proposed new Bordentown City logo, and others noting the increased pedestrian safety that will result from sidewalk and intersection improvements. Concerns about the potential loss of some parking spaces and the ability of trucks to negotiate corners were also mentioned. The Study will incorporate these comments and be presented to the Planning Board for adoption in May.

## Delaware & Raritan Canal Towpath links to Bordentown City

The section of the old Delaware & Raritan Canal towpath that extended from Lock#2 in Trenton (near Lamberton Road) to Lock # 1 (across Crosswicks Creek from the Bordentown Yacht Club) will soon be reconstructed. This project will create a 3+ mile off-road walking and biking path through the Hamilton-Trenton-Bordentown Marsh, with additional segments eventually extending the trail from Waterfront Park in Trenton all the way to Bordentown City. Residents will be able to access the trail via the RiverLINE pedestrian bridge across Crosswicks Creek. Construction began in March, and should be completed by Fall.

The BCEC has received 100 free "Bags on Board" pet waste bag dispensers through the generous donation of the manufacturer.
